Four-year Combined BBA/MBA Option

This special program allows high-achieving students to complete both a Bachelor's and Master's degree in as few as four calendar years, assuming full-time enrollment in three semesters per year.

Financial aid can make it happen

Institutional Aid

During the 2022-2023 award year, more than \$27 million in direct Berkeley College institutional aid was awarded. This amount is in addition to any federal and state aid. A range of grants and scholarships are available to qualified students. You can learn more about the most up-to-date offerings, which include:

Achievement Award

Incoming full-time and part-time students enrolled in a degree program with a 2.50 grade point average (GPA) or higher will be considered for an award. Full-time students can receive up to \$8,000 per standard academic year, based on GPA and date of application submission or readmitting effective date. Part-time students can receive up to 15% off tuition per standard academic year based on GPA and credit load. Students must maintain cumulative Berkeley College GPA of 2.5 or higher at the time award renewal takes place, which generally occurs every two semesters.

Deadline date for each term:

Winter 2024 term completed before October 1, 2023

Spring 2024 term completed before February 1, 2024

Honors Scholarship

2024 high school graduates who are accepted to the Honors Program may receive up to a half-tuition scholarship based on their high school GPA of 3.50 or higher and review of transcript by the Honors Committee. Students must meet all federal and state grant application deadlines each year and receive a valid Institutional Student Information Report (ISIR). (If a student fails to meet the state deadlines and is now not eligible where they would have ordinarily received the award, calculation of the honors award will be less than that amount.)

Students must maintain full-time, continuous, consecutive term enrollment and maintain a cumulative Berkeley College GPA of 3.50 or higher at the end of each award year to retain their scholarship. Students who initially enroll in an Associate's degree program and continue into a Bachelor's degree program may continue to renew until completion of the Bachelor's degree.

Deadline to apply July 1, 2024.

Presidential Scholarship

Each campus awards one student a full-tuition scholarship each academic year. All other eligible students may receive up to a 30% of tuition scholarship. All awards are based on High School GPA. Students must maintain a full-time, continuous, consecutive term enrollment, a cumulative 3.50 GPA, and satisfactory academic progress. First-time students enrolled in a degree program must complete all admissions requirements by December 15, 2023 to be considered for this scholarship.

Alumni Legacy Scholarship

A scholarship up to 30 percent may be awarded to full-time students in a degree program who have had at least one parent, grandparent, or legal guardian graduate from Berkeley College. Students must maintain full-time, continuous, consecutive term enrollment, and maintain a cumulative Berkeley College GPA of 2.50 or higher at the end of each award year to retain their scholarship.

Berkeley College Grant

The amounts for this grant vary based on need and enrollment status. Students must maintain a cumulative Berkeley College GPA of 1.50 or higher at the end of each award year to retain their scholarship and maintain satisfactory academic progress.

Federal and State Aid

Financial assistance programs are available from federal and state sources, including:

- Federal Pell Grants
- Federal Supplemental Grants
- New York TAP
- New Jersey TAG
- Low-interest student and parent loan program

If you wish to apply for financial aid, you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). You may apply electronically at fafsa.gov. The Financial Aid Office can help answer questions regarding your options.

Berkeley College offers a number of grants and scholarships. With the exception of international and need-based grants, Berkeley College grant and scholarship awards are applied after all federal grants, Post-9/11 GI bill amounts, state grants, and state scholarships have been applied, not to exceed the remaining tuition amount. Berkeley College need-based grant awards are determined after all federal grants, Post-9/11 GI bill amounts, state grants, state scholarships, Berkeley College grants and scholarships (not need-based), outside resources (such as private scholarships, VA benefits other than Post-9/11 GI bill, tuition reimbursement, etc.), and federal subsidized loans have been applied. Some Berkeley College grants and scholarships may not be combined. Berkeley College reserves the right to add, discontinue, or modify its programs and policies at any time. Berkeley College Newark Promise Grant

Qualified residents of Essex County, NJ may attend the Berkeley College Newark campus as a full-time student in certain Associate's degree programs without incurring any loans for tuition and fees. Qualified students will receive a Berkeley College Newark Promise Grant to cover tuition and fees after all federal and state grants have been applied. Students who complete their Associate's degree may be able to complete their Bachelor's degree online or at the Woodland Park campus without incurring any loans for tuition or fees, if they continue to meet the program criteria and have sufficient federal and state financial aid eligibility to complete a Bachelor's degree.
