#### Achievement Award

Incoming full-time and part-time students enrolled in a degree program with a 2.50 grade point average (GPA) or higher will be considered for an award. Full-time students can receive up to \$8,000 per standard academic year, based on GPA and date of application submission or readmitting effective date. Part-time students can receive up to 15% off tuition per standard academic year based on GPA and credit load. Students must maintain cumulative Berkeley College GPA of 2.5 or higher at the time award renewal takes place, which generally occurs every two semesters.

Deadline date for each term:

Winter 2024 term completed before October 1, 2023

Spring 2024 term completed before February 1, 2024

#### Transfer Opportunity Program Grant

This up to 30 percent tuition grant is open to eligible students who enroll full-time in one of Berkeley's Bachelor's degree programs after receiving an Associate's degree from an accredited United States college (other than Berkeley College). Award percentages are based on cumulative GPA. Students must maintain a GPA of 2.00 or higher at the end of the award year and maintain satisfactory academic progress.

#### Corporate Learning Partnership

Through the Corporate Learning Partnership Program, employees of member organizations may be eligible for up to a 30 percent tuition reduction for themselves and their immediate family members toward online and on-site degree programs.\*

#### Alumni Legacy Scholarship

A scholarship up to 30 percent may be awarded to full-time students in a degree program who have had at least one parent, grandparent, or legal guardian graduate from Berkeley College. Students must maintain full-time, continuous, consecutive term enrollment, and maintain a cumulative Berkeley College GPA of 2.50 or higher at the end of each award year to retain their scholarship.

#### Yellow Ribbon Grant

Awarded to veterans enrolled in a degree program who have 100 percent Post-9/11 GI Bill eligibility. Students receive 50 percent of their balance after all benefits are applied.

#### Berkeley College Grant

The amounts for this grant vary based on need and enrollment status. Students must maintain a cumulative Berkeley College GPA of 1.50 or higher at the end of each award year to retain their scholarship and maintain satisfactory academic progress.

\*Not all programs are eligible for this reduction opportunity.

Berkeley College need-based grant awards are determined after all federal grants, Post-9/11 GI bill amounts, state grants, state scholarships, Berkeley College grants and scholarships (not need-based), outside resources (such as private scholarships, VA benefits other than Post-9/11 GI bill, tuition reimbursement, etc.), and federal subsidized loans have been applied.
